**RE: Ofsted Monitoring Visit – Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2021**

I am writing to share with parents/carers that we will be welcoming an Inspector tomorrow to complete a one-day monitoring visit of the Academy.

Our previous inspection took place in March, where we received positive feedback on our remote-learning provision and our wider response in ensuring learning and well-being remain at the heart of what we do, during the pandemic.

Parental feedback was a key part of this positive inspection and I have been asked again to share with you how parents are able to give their views.

To register your views, you will need to provide your email address, which will be held securely. It will not be used for any purpose other than providing access to the online survey. Neither schools nor Ofsted will have access to any email addresses.

Please complete the online survey as soon as possible, preferably by 11am on the day of the inspection, as this will give the inspection team more time to consider your views.
