# **Y9 Boys STEM Trip to AECC**


Our students spent a day on AECC campus in Southbourne for Boys in Science STEM Day, where



they received a talk from a leading physiotherapist; and then rotated around 4 workshops to include radiotherapy and the use of virtual reality (physics and biology); a visit to the Xray suite; a session in the dry model lab looking at body parts.

Our students were engaged, inspired; and had the opportunity to ask questions and interact with professionals in STEM field.









## **Year 10 Geography Field Trip**

On Monday, 11th July our year 10 Geography group had their fieldtrip to Swanage. The excitement at the beginning of the day was palpable. We were going to the beach!

This fieldtrip was part of our physical geography enquiry, and students had the opportunity to investigate a hypothesis through the analysis of



secondary data (maps, images) as well as collecting primary data themselves. This involved measuring the width of the beach (both south and north of the groynes) and the drop along the



groynes (in three places: sea wall, mid-length and at the water line). All these measurements were hard work in the blazing sun, but our students did us proud. They all did their bit, working in teams, measuring and recording the data. A welcome break in the shade, with iced drinks, ice-creams, managed to give us the boost we needed to go through with all our planned measurements.

We came back with the satisfaction of a job well done (despite some confusion on which groynes we had measured, which we managed to iron out). What remained to be done was analyse our data and reach a final conclusion on whether longshore drift is successfully managed in Swanage Bay. Since all our measurements show that there is a quantitative difference between south and north, both in beach width and groyne drop, we have proven our hypothesis to be correct: yes, longshore drift is successfully managed- without the groynes the sand would be transported from south to north, resulting in the beach

getting thinner and thinner and ultimately disappearing.

Fieldtrips like these are massively important and helpful in understanding coastal processes and coastal management. We consider ourselves lucky to be the first GCSE cohort to be able to carry out our geographical enquiries in the wake of the pandemic. This will help our students not only achieve higher marks in their exams, but also have a better understanding of the world around us.





## Year 10 Health and Social Care/Child Care Trip

Thursday 21st July saw students from Year 10 option subjects head to Paultons Park with the task of observing and recording how the park caters for children under 5, focusing on risk assessments and safety for the public. This is to support coursework units on Safety and Security.

Students were fantastic, they enjoyed the rides especially as they raced round taking advantage of little que times. Layla Franklin demonstrated extreme sporting skills to win a Pepper by getting the balls in the bucket on her first attempt. Mr Randall decided her was Daddy Pig and even brought the t-shirt to suit.






Skirts should be pleated and fall just above the knee. Girls will be asked to change if skirts are too short.


Students cannot wear leggings, apart from in PE.
