Rewards

Each students' rewards are communicated to them during tutor time and assemblies and parent/carers are also informed via postcards and texts sent home. Sanctions

Occasionally, some students do not make the right choices in terms of their behaviour or attitude and consequently, there are clear sanctions in place to support those individuals. Everyone makes mistakes and it is important that our students recognise this. I know that parent/carers are keen to work with the academy and we are extremely grateful for your support. Information on your child's behaviour, any detentions, achievement and attendance can be found on your Parent App. This highlights the points they are receiving for these categories. The attendance is given as a %.

Our detention system has been reviewed and I would like to share with you the following set of expectations:

If a student does not meet our basic expectations within the classroom and a 'Lesson Removal' is issued, a detention will be set. The subject teacher will always make contact home to discuss this with you. It is at this time that the date will be discussed so everyone is very clear of the reason for this removal.
