# RE: Principals Update - Term 1, Week 3

It is hard to believe that three weeks have now passed since the start of term, and the move over to A block. Students have quickly adjusted to the changes finding their way to lessons. There is no doubt that the learning environments have been enhanced and staff and students are really appreciating this. This week also saw the last of a series of meetings I have been attending, pulling together the finer plans for the new build. It really is an exciting time for Oak, and I look forward to being able to share more information with you.

This week myself and Mr Everton have been lucky enough to be in lots of lessons looking at what students have been learning. Going from lesson to we have seen a real breath of curriculum and fantastic engagement from students. Below is just a snapshot of what we have seen.

- Year 7 students have been reading Oliver Twist so beautifully in English and learning passing and shooting skills in either netball, football, or basketball. There have even been a few apple crumbles made. I hope you as parents got to enjoy them 😊
- Year 8 students have been challenging themselves to identify whether texts were written in second of third person form in English whilst continuing their mandala designs in textiles.
- Year 9 geographers have been investigating the microclimates around Oak Academy and then analysing data, using this to determine best sites for sunflowers, picnic areas, solar panels, and wind turbines. Whilst in performing arts they have been rehearsing different elements of a 'Stormzy' track to pull together an ensemble in music creating short plays around social media messaging in drama.
- Year 10 students have been investigating transition metals salts using flame tests in Science and calculating with indices in maths.
- Year 11 developing high level pastry skills making profiterole rings in catering whilst art students have been using a variety of mark making methods to draw natural forms.

In all lessons students have been proud to show me their work and without doubt I have seen plenty examples of students living out our 'core values' through their learning.
