Ask	Ask you child about their learning

Support	Support them to explore beyond the curriculum – read/watch/listen

English	Literary Heritage: Oliver Twist. Writing Mastery and Reading for Pleasure (using either Lexia or Reading Plus).
Geography	Europe and the UK: Atlas and map skills including continents and features such as latitude, the Tropics and Prime Meridian.
History	Enquiry Question: What is history? A study of the Silk Roads focusing on core skills of chronology, cause and consequence, and historical sources.
Maths	Unit 1. Analysing and Displaying data, Unit 2 Number skills
Music	Elements of Music - In this Performing Arts rotation students learn about the building blocks of music through singing.

Tutor Time Reading

- Culturally rich and diverse texts.

Disciplinary Literacy

- Reading intervention programmes are rooted in cross-curricular reads.
- Talking about words. Explicit teaching of Tier 2 Vocabulary across the curriculum.

Pushing a love of reading

- Reading Hub. This is our Library where students can borrow books from.
- Diverse texts in tutor time reading.
- Parent reading support lessons / information sessions to support reading at home.

To have a go, get stuck in and enjoy Oak Academy and its opportunities









We look forward to next year's reward trip and having an even greater number of students attend another amazing opportunity.


Bullying

Bullying is defined by the DfE:

- behaviour by an individual or group *repeated over time*
- that is intended to hurt or harm another individual or group
- either physically or emotionally.



4 Types of BULLYING



Hitting, kicking, slapping, pinching, spitting, tripping, pushing, blocking

Stealing or destroying someone's possessions

Making mean or rude hand gestures

Touching in unwanted and inappropriate ways



Name calling

Insults

Teasing

Intimidation

Homophobic or racist remarks

Inappropriate sexual comments

Taunting

Threatening to cause harm



Lying and spreading rumors

Leaving someone out on purpose

Telling others not to be friends with someone

Embarrassing someone in public

Damaging someone's social reputation or relationships



Posting/sending hurtful texts emails or posts, images or videos

Making online threats

Imitating others online or using their log-in

Deliberately excluding others online

Spreading nasty gossip or rumors online
