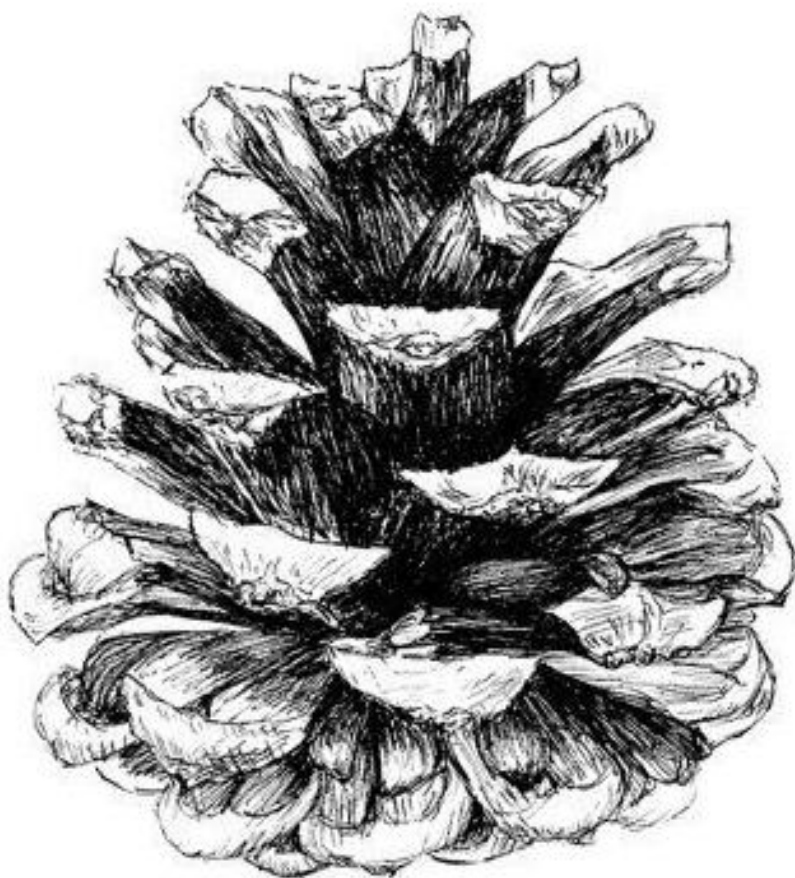

**HL1 – To recreate the pinecone to accurate scale, proportion and mark making.**

**Remember to do this on a loose sheet of paper so this can go into your sketchbooks.**



**Remember – the closer the lines, the darker the “shade” will appear.**

**Take your time – if you rush work.**

## **HL 2- To create a copy of the pumpkin using the correct colour and texture.**

**Remember to do this on a loose sheet of plain paper so this can go into your class sketchbooks.**

### **Top tip!**

- **Sketch out the sphere in pencil.**
- **Use watercolour or colour pencil for the colour.**
- **Rub out the pencil guide lines.**

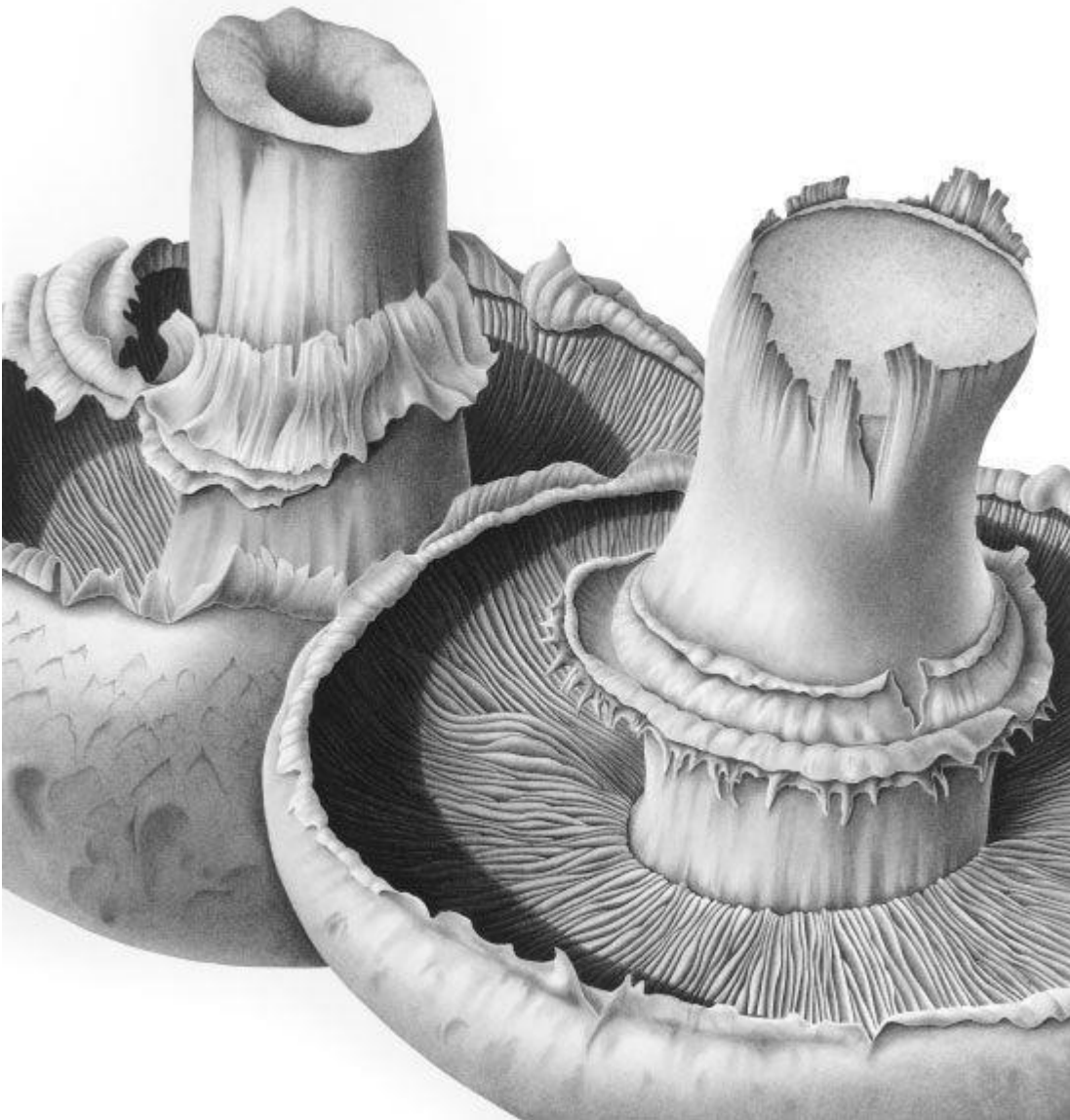


## **HL3 – To create an observational study the mushrooms– using 2B/4B pencil.**

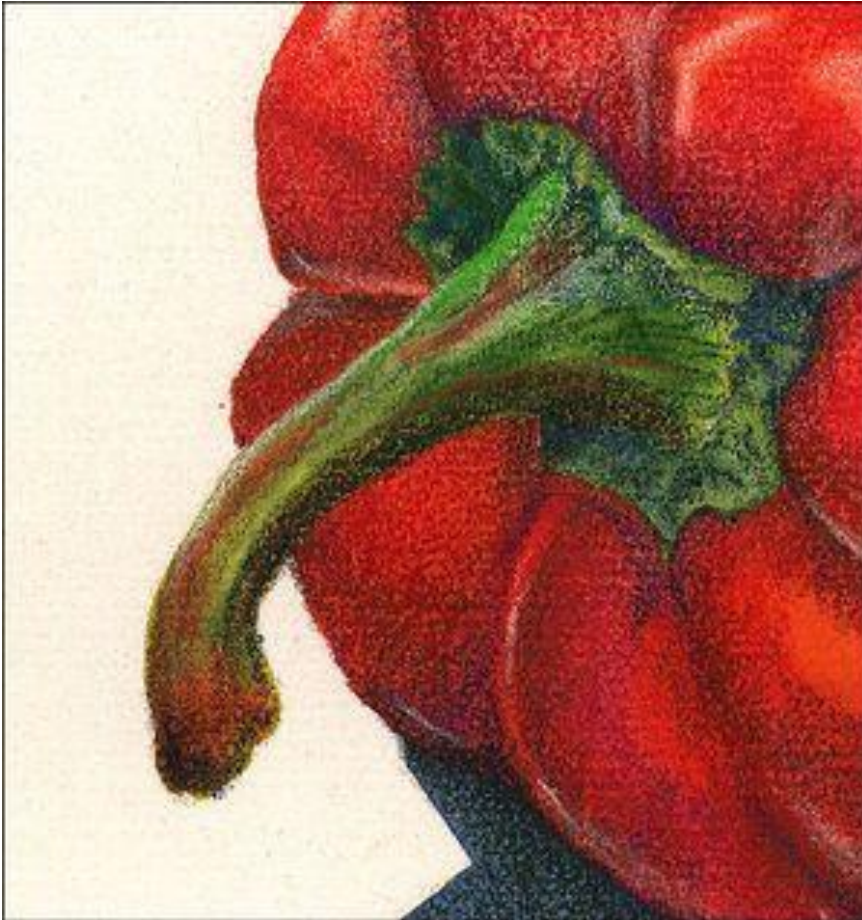
**Remember to do this on a loose piece of plain paper so it can go into your sketchbooks.**

### **Remember!**

- **You can start out with a HB pencil and then layer in the tone.**
- **Carefully observe the direction of lines when applying hatching, and solid blocks of tone.**



## **HL4 – To create an observational study of the pepper stalk – using colour pencil.**

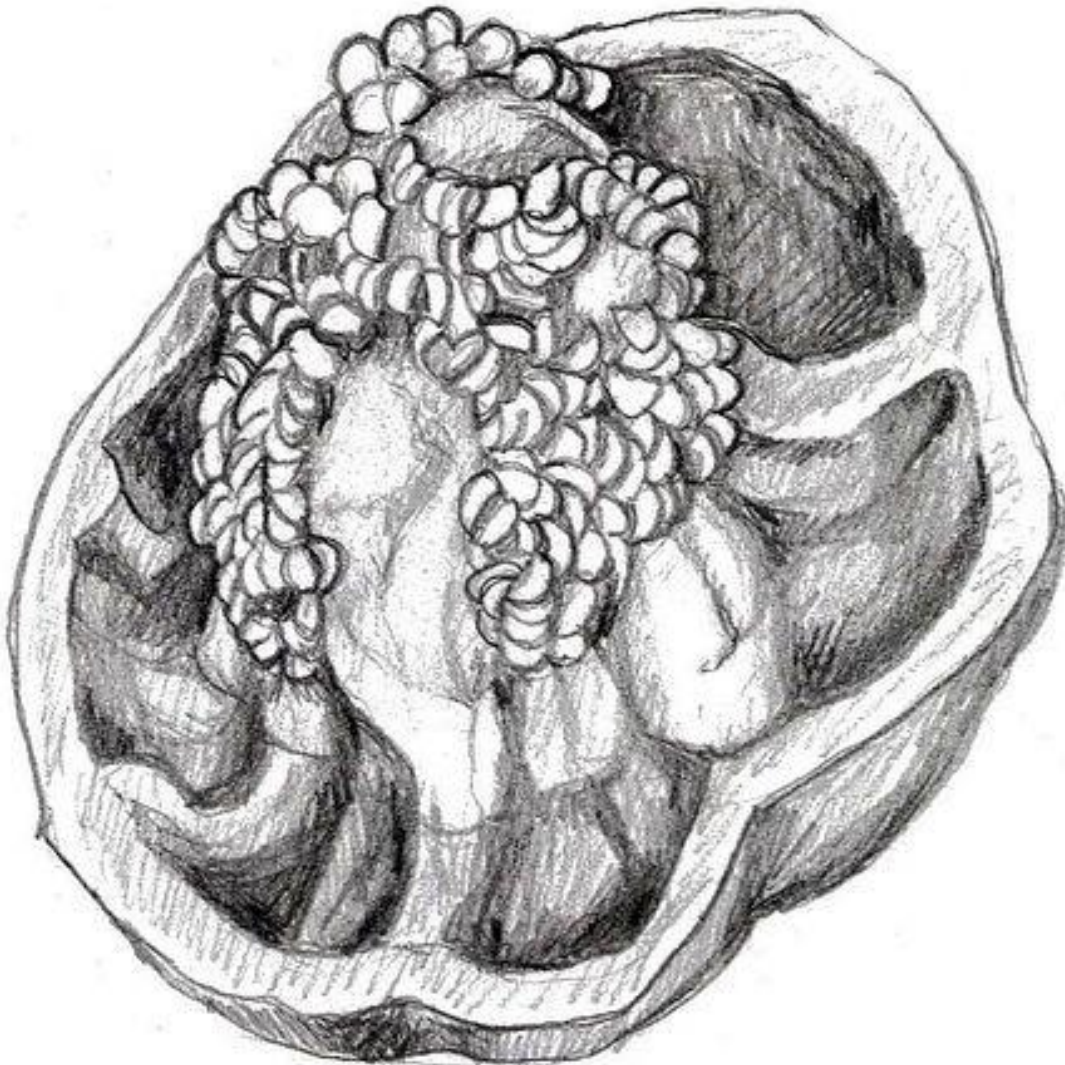


**Remember that this is a realistic representation and requires the light reflection to look 3D.**

**I would recommend that you complete this drawing on A3 paper, then trim the excess – you may end up squashing the circle if you try and fit it onto A4!**

## **HL5 – To create an observational study of the underside of a pepper stalk.**

**Separate paper please, make it a good size as the smaller you draw, the more you will need to produce to fill the page in the sketchbook!**



**HL6 – To recreate the gourd – using appropriate materials.**



**This is the most complex home learning task so far this term.**

**Select your chosen medium and aim to fill as much of the A4 page as possible.**

**Take your time with the shading – use chiaroscuro to create the beautiful texture.**
